



SEL Day , Ms. Major-Phillips





During our research into winter for the science benchmark, the students in room 324 discovered that the biggest snowflake ever recorded was 15 inches across and 8 inches wide! We decided to see if we could recreate the dimensions of this snowflake using alternative materials, such as sentence strips, paper and cups. We really enjoyed the different ways to create the snowflake!

Room 200, Ms. Lonon & Ms. Morris


Room 200 has been learning about plants, animals, and sea life; especially fish. OBAMA, our class Beta fish, is helping us learn about a fish's anatomy. The class is fascinated by the dorsal fin on top of the fish's body. The dorsal fin is located on the top of the fish and is used for stability when swimming through the water so that the beta can swim in a straight line.

We completed our experiment using celery stalks, water, and food coloring, studying the importance of plant roots. By looking through the microscope, we really were able to see the roots. Now we are preparing for our Science Fair Project, "How Can You Read Mirror Writing." We used the Scien-

tific Method when testing our theory.

mail every week!








"Preschool room 100 is so excited to send and receive

Pre-K Classroom Room 112






TMES Linkit! Data Shows Growth!



We are so excited that our overall average scores for <u>both</u> ELA and Math had increases in all grades. This is important because as we all know, it has been a historical trend that students tend to decline in scores from the Form A to Form B assessment due to changes in the complexities of assessment questions based on the evolution of standards-based skills and the variances in scoring quantiles between benchmarks. This is a great attribute to the dedication and hard work that classroom teachers, and being a student-centered building, have put forth throughout this school year and it is delightful to be able to share this positive "glow" with everyone!
