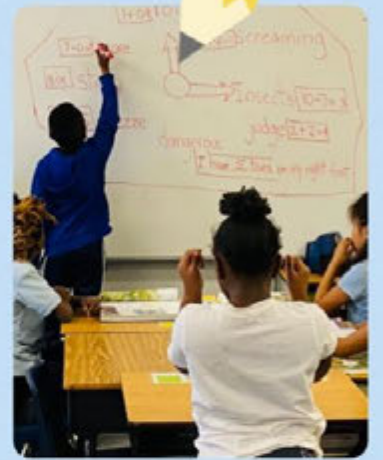
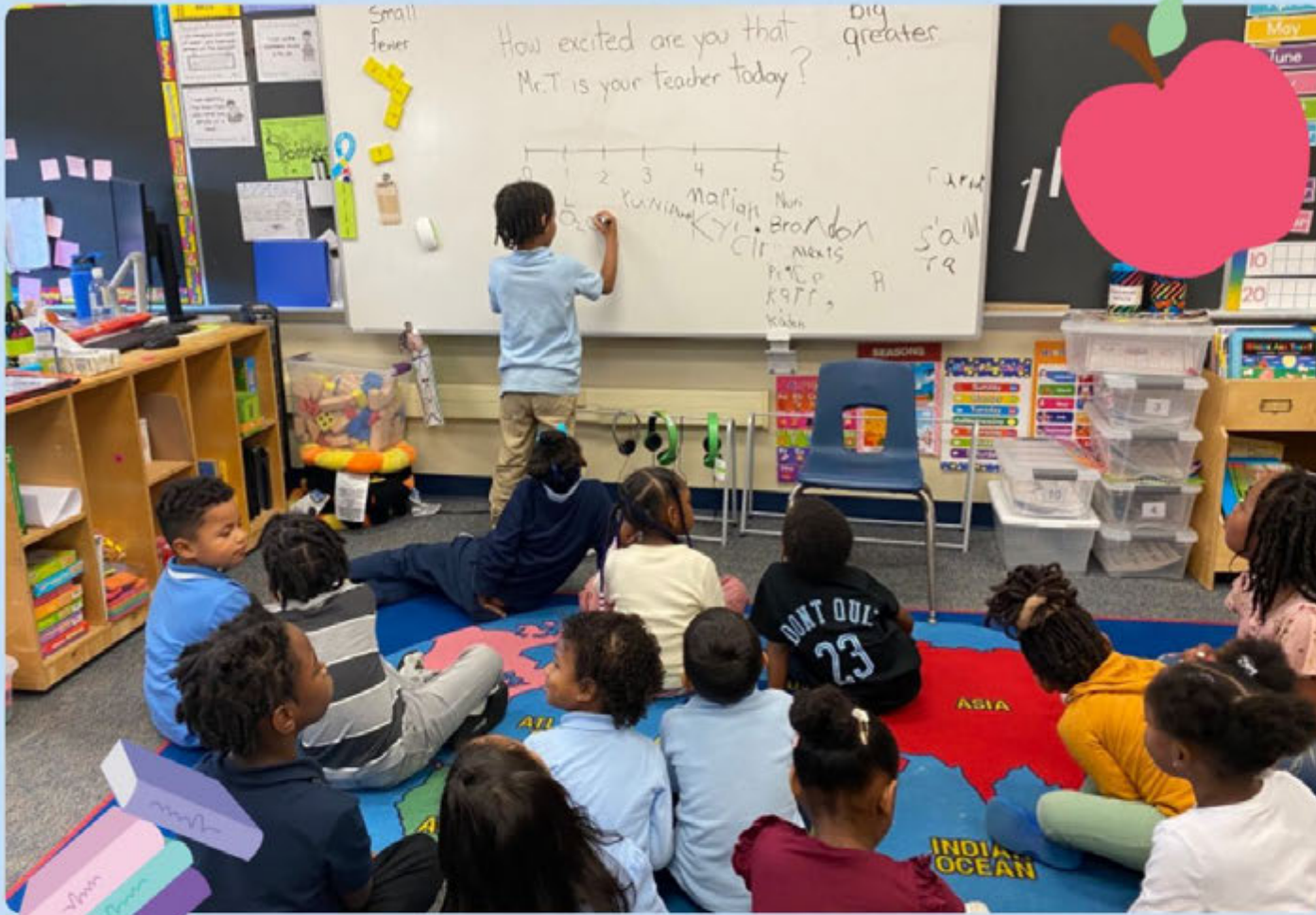


GREAT WORK!!

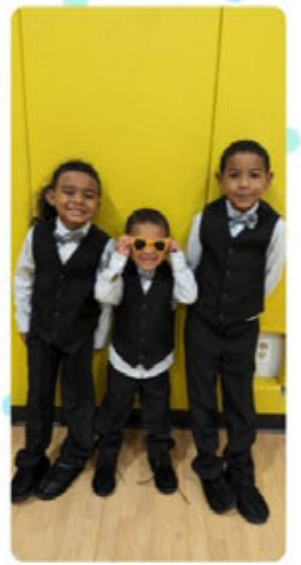
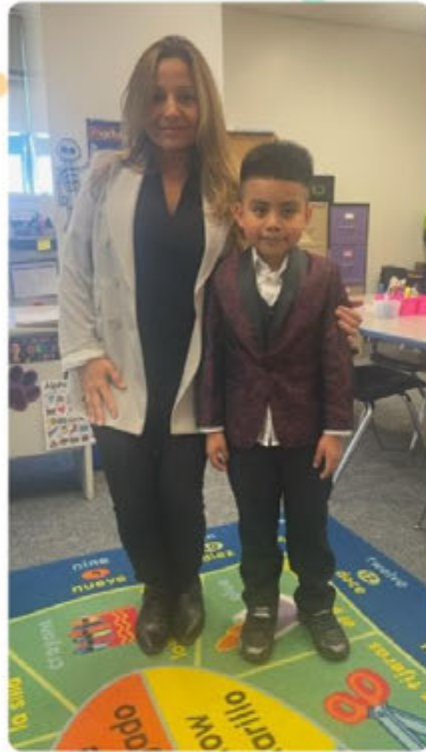

We concluded our celebration with an evening of Latin rhythms and dance.



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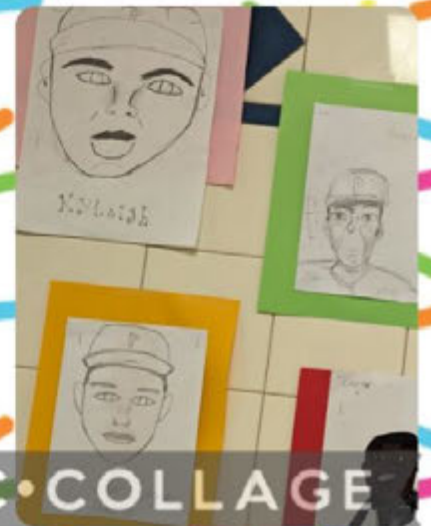
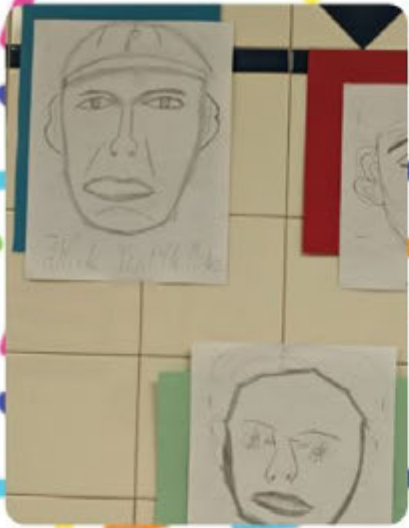
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October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. During this month we take the time to give thought to the trends in breast cancer research, prevention, and treatment.

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NATIONAL FIRE PREVENTION -WEEK-

Thank you to the Asbury Park Fire Department for spending time with us to teach our children all about what firefighters do and how to stay safe in a fire emergency.

The firefighters shared some key home fire escape planning tips:

- ★ Make sure your plan meets the needs of all your family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- ★ Smoke alarms should be installed inside every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of your home. Smoke alarms should be interconnected so when one sounds, they all sound.
- ★ Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows open easily. Have an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- ★ Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and once at night.
